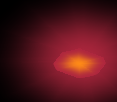

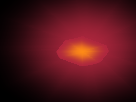

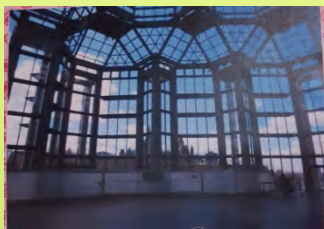

POST SECONDARY BENEFITS

- Studying languages to the 30-level, may allow a student to replace a Math 30 or Social Studies 30 mark with the language 30 mark. (check the requirements with each post-secondary institution directly)

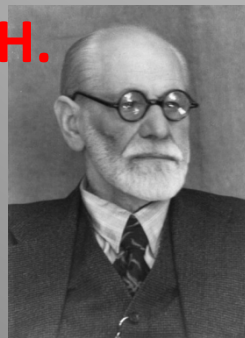
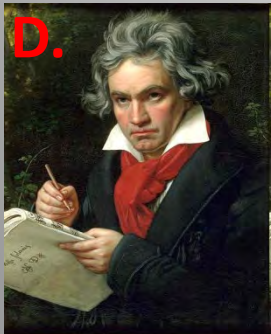
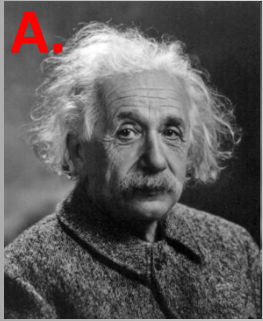
GOOD REASONS TO LEARN GERMAN



- German is the most widely spoken language in Europe.
- Germany has the 3rd strongest economy and is the #3 export nation in the world.
- Studying medicine, business, sciences, art? - German is the second most commonly used scientific language. Germany is the third largest contributor to research and development and offers research fellowships to foreign scientists.
- German is required/recommended by many undergraduate + graduate programs.
- Germany financially sponsors over 60,000 international exchanges each year.
